About Circular SPN/LG No. 2/2010

The purpose of this circular is to notify all interested parties of the changes made to the guidance issued on the tiered contribution rate system for the Local Government Pension Scheme in Scotland.

Please find attached version 3 of the guidance on the operation of the tiered contribution rate system for the Local Government Pension Scheme in Scotland. This version replaces version 2 which was issued in February 2009.





Changes to the guidance are as follows:

- Changes have been made to allow employers the choice of the pay period to revise rates at the start of each tax year.
- Under para 5 (e) employers can determine the period in each new tax year, as not all employers have the same pay frequencies and pay dates.
- The guidance now contains more clarity about "31 March" and "tax years".
- References to "2009" have been removed to avoid further annual updates.
- The guidance clarifies that the rates have not changed in 2010.
- The references to "old protection" for ex-manual workers paying 5% have been removed.

Administering Authorities are asked to ensure that version 3 of the guidance is forwarded to LGPS employers.
